## What students should be working on



- Developing a list of colleges
- Signing up for rep visits (Naviance) and visiting campuses (or virtual tours)
- Completing a draft of their college essay
- Completing student and parent response forms and student activity sheet.
- Completing teacher recommendation requests (form and on Naviance)
- If Applicable: Signing up on NCAA Eligibility Center to register to play Division I or Division II College Athletics

## **College Selection Factors to Consider**



- Academic Programs (Major, Internships, Honors, etc.)
- Geography (Commute, Distance, Urban, Suburban, International, etc.)
- Cost
- •Size (Small < 3,000, Medium 3,000-7000)

  Large > 7,000)
- Campus Life (Dorms, Activities, Religion, Sports, Diversity, etc.)
- Special Programs (Study Abroad, Co-Op, Learning Disability Services etc.)



## **Develop the College List**

- **Reach**: This group includes highly selective schools that the student aspires to. These will be your "reach" schools.
- Target: This group includes schools at which the probability of admission is likely. These are categorized as "target" schools.
- Safety: This group includes schools at which the probability of admission is "highly likely" to "certain."

## **Student Responsibilities**

- Attend senior seminars and meet with school counselor
- Finalize college application list and college essay.
- Submit applications by the specified deadlines.
- Input all colleges into Naviance as "Colleges Applying To".
- Request official test scores (SAT, ACT) from testing companies (if not applying test optional).
- Complete and submit all forms to your school counselor (record release form, student response form, student activity sheet).
- Check status of applications regularly on the college portals.



## Parent Responsibilities



- Provide support and encouragement during the college process.
- Complete parent brag sheet and submit to school counselor.
- Review and sign records release form.
- Attend MEFA College Financial Planning Virtual Webinar.
- Assist with FAFSA and CSS Profile (if applicable).



### **Counselor Responsibilities**

- Advise students on the college admissions process.
- Provide feedback on the college list.
- Write counselor statement for each student.
- Send official transcripts, recommendations (counselor and teacher) and school profile to colleges to which students have applied.
- Send additional grade updates to colleges as needed (initial, mid-year, final).





### **Naviance**

A career/college planning tool.



#### Use it to:

- Develop a list of colleges.
- Register for college visits.
- Add colleges to Naviance.
- Upload transcripts, recommendations and LHS profile sheet, send all electronically to colleges.



## **Testing**

- Most colleges are test optional.
- Check college website to verify test optional status.
- •Students with test scores may decide to submit if score is higher than or equal to the average score for that college.
- College uniformly intend to provide a holistic application review for admission and merit scholarship eligibility.
- Self report testing policy.



## **Types of Admission**

#### **EARLY ACTION (EA):**

- Apply November/December
- Decision December/January

#### **EARLY DECISION (ED):**

- Apply November/December
- Decision December/January

#### **REGULAR DECISION (RD):**

- Apply Jan–March
- Decision March/April

#### **ROLLING**

Apply when ready – decision usually within 4 weeks





## **Types of Admissions**

#### **Early Decision**

- Binding You are obligated to attend if you are accepted.
- •Submit applications early fall, usually Nov 1 or Nov 15, check with college.
- •You will be notified in Dec. or Jan., well before the usual notification if you've been accepted.

#### **Early Action**

- •Non-binding/allows for other regular decision applications and review of financial aid packages.
- Decision by Dec. or Jan. for EA.
- You may wait until 5/1/23 to accept.



## Universities of Massachusetts Admission Requirements

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- •SAT/ACT on sliding scale if GPA is below minimum Example: **University of Massachusetts**

<u>GPA</u>	<u>SAT</u>	<u>ACT</u>
2.51 – 2.99	1030	20
2.41 - 2.50	1070	21
2.31 - 2.40	1110	22
2.21 - 2.30	1140	23
2.11 - 2.20	1180	24
2.00 - 2.10	1220	25



## MA State Colleges/Universities Admission Requirements

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- •SAT/ACT on sliding scale if GPA is below min.

**Example: Worcester State University** 

<u>GPA</u>	<u>SAT</u>	<u>ACT</u>
2.51 – 2.99	990	19
2.41 - 2.50	1030	20
2.31 - 2.40	1070	21
2.21 - 2.30	1110	22
2.11 - 2.20	1140	23
2.00 - 2.10	1180	24



## **Commonwealth Commitment**



#### **STUDENTS COMMIT TO:**

- Begin at one of Massachusetts' Community Colleges
- Complete associate degree within 2.5 years
- Transfer to one of the MA State Universities or UMASS campuses
- Complete bachelor's degree within 2 more years
- Maintain full time, continuous enrollment and a cumulative GPA of 3.0

#### **COMMONWEALTH COMMITMENT TO STUDENTS:**

- A freeze on tuition and fees for all four years
- A reduction in tuition and mandatory fees by an average of \$5,090 over four years.

- This is your chance to show admission officers the personal side of you.





### **Key Dates**

- Student must submit college applications by the set deadlines.
- •Submit records release form, student activity form, student response form, and parent response forms to the school counseling office by **October 17, 2022**.
  - \*Students may need to submit forms earlier, especially if they have deadlines before November 1.
- Counselors will submit transcripts and letters of recommendations to colleges.

## CSS/PROFILE

- Colleges use <u>CSS Profile</u> to award non-federal student aid funds. Some colleges require non-custodial parent to complete a non-custodial profile form.
- Register at www.cssprofile.collegeboard.org
- Available on October 1, 2022.
- •2 step process Registration and Application.
- •A \$25.00 registration fee that includes submission to one college plus \$16.00 per each additional college requiring profile (free if family income < \$100,000).

## John and Abigail Adams Scholarship

- Tuition waiver at MA state colleges and universities. (Range \$910 - \$1714)
- Awarded to students who score in the top 25% of 10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS in their district.
- Notification in November 2022.



## **MCAS Certificate of Mastery**

This scholarship also offers tuition waiver at MA State Colleges and Universities. Awarded to students who meet the following requirements.

- 1. Score of advanced in at least one 10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS subject and proficient or advanced on the remaining sections of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS tests.
- 2. Two additional academic accomplishments in addition to their qualifying MCAS scores.



### **MCAS** Certificate of Mastery

- 2 AP exams with a score of 3 or higher.
  - 2 SAT Subject Test exams (with qualifying scores).
  - 1 AP exam and 1 SAT Subject Test exam.
- 1 SAT Subject Test exam and 1 other accomplishment.

Qualifying students must complete an application (available in the school counseling office).
